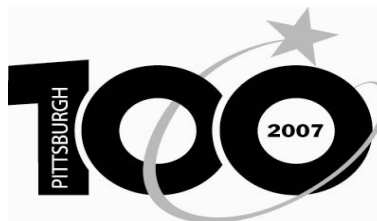

### **CLG HONORED AS ONE OF THE NATION'S FASTEST GROWING COMPANIES**

With 86 full time employees and nearly 60 consultants, they have also greatly increased their employee numbers, with a 113.2 percent growth over the past two years.
